# Celebrating the 75th Anniversary of Calix

Dear Calix friends,

The St. Paul East Calix Unit is honored to sponsor the 2024 Calix Retreat, with the theme "CARRYING THE MESSAGE" a sequence to the wonderful Eucharistic Congress recently held at the Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Indiana from July17-21. A number of Calix brothers and sisters were in attendance and many others followed it on the EWTN and various other podcasts and Media transmissions.

It was just amazing to witness the thousands of faithful, who participated in the 10th National Eucharistic Congress processions across the country and the many other Eucharistic processions throughout our cities and towns. Jesus was always at the forefront of all processions calling us to follow Him. We, Calix members, are a Eucharistic people finding our strength in recovery from our reception of the Holy Eucharist. "He is our bread of life that comes down from heaven to nourish and sanctify us.

On this 75fth Anniversary of Calix, we honor our founder William Montroy, from St. Paul, Minnesota in 1947. "In the beginning ......Then God said, "Let us make man in our own image, after our own likeness." In the eternal truth, we come to know that Mister Montroy was to become a saint and form other saints in the image and likeness of God. In his early twenties, Mister Montroy, overwhelmed with his own drinking problem , he receive an indelible experience. Standing in front of a news stand on Broad and Oregon Streets in South Philadelphia, he looked above wooden shack at a double-sided sign. On the first side of that billboard he read: "Dear Jesus, I have a problem and its ME." Walking around to the other side he read the remedy. "Dear brother, I have a solution to your problem and its ME."

<u>Jesus is the solution to our problem.</u> In a letter to Sister Mary Madonna, Poor Clare nun, August 29, 1976, Mr. Montroy wrote about our spiritual helper. "In over thirty years in A.A. and Calix, when I needed help, I asked the Holy Spirit as to how I should go about it. I have found that working through the Holy Spirit will solve our problems.

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In an anonymous, "God letter " we read:

#### "Dear God.

So far today, I have done all right. I haven't cursed, lied, cheated or stole. I haven't lost my temper or been impatient. I haven't been grumpy, nasty selfish nor greedy,. No drink, no drugs, no impure thoughts or bad words. No dreadful deeds. And I thank you for that. But in a little while, Dear God, I will be getting out of bed and I will need all the help I can get."

The Third person of the Blessed Trinity, the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, - the Helper, - who makes Jesus present, is the helper that we all need, especially for addicts.

As Calix members, we pray, that God will bless all, who in our will to glorify, will adopt the principles and practices of Calix. Shower, 0 Lord, us with the help to repel all temptations to our former excesses. Refresh us with love of Your sacramental presence in the Holy Eucharist, so that our state of goodness will be a continuing act of praise to our Divine Provider. Amen.

#### August 10 in person Calix meeting at Saint Joseph, Enfield


Consultation with members and prayer leads me to favour simplicity. Meeting is therefore:

## We are a Eucharistic People - Carrying the Message



Overall, I had a experience at this, Connecting in perfaces and newcomwith Calix friends back!




water to pull him out. Who can't relate to that drowning feeling?

Interestingly enough, this is one of the few images that I can connect you to the actual artist who painted it. Please support Yongsung Kim by clicking here and purchasing his work if you are so moved! He has many other beautiful paintings in addition to the one shown here.

On the flip side of the image you'll find Moment Prayers that I've used a lot over the last few years. They are simple and sing a bit like nursery rhymes, but they work when I remember to use them.

For me at least, it is all about staying in the present moment as much as possible. C.S. Lewis says in the Screwtape Letters that God wants humans:

"to attend chiefly to two things, to eternity itself, and to that point of time which they call the Present. For the Present is the point at which time touches eternity."



Getting there is the hard part, for one must release the past moments to God's care and completely trust Him to transform them into something beautiful and good. Then with future moments, especially the dreaded ones, trusting that He is already there waiting, ready to give counsel on how to behave lovingly and ready to give comfort should it prove painful, for after all, He has endured a bit of pain along the way and knows how it feels to be unfairly treated. He goes before us into every moment (Mt. 28:7).

Bottom line, and this is important to anyone, but especially those of us with serious abandonment issues, He will never let us go through it alone. Even when I step out of the boat and start looking at the waves and sink under the waters, he smiles and reaches down through and pulls me back up. He never leaves me.

# Calix Reaches Seminarians

Our credo advises we meet as people working a 12-step program. Step 12 provides that upon having a spiritual awakening, we try to carry the message to others trying to recover or maintain recovery.

The ST PAUL MINNESOTA unit wants to carry the message of CALIX to parishes. There is outreach by having our brochures and meetings listed in bulletins and other communications as a resource for those in need - coming at the Diocese level and at parishes.

Many priests do not know of Calix or addiction ministry that we can provide parishioners. One effort to improve this is to teach seminarians about the disease and its impact to as high as 25-50% of those in the pews. And further the education on the basics of addiction treatment. We educate about Calix as a holy resource for those who want to maximize their faith to aid in recovery.

In June of 2024, the ST PAUL unit conducted its 3rd annual session with seminarians, in partnership with St Paul MN Seminary.



As part of the session, The unit also conducts a shortened "live meeting" to show how we conduct our meetings.



The session leaves a wonderful impression upon those men soon to be responsible for a parish. The disease impacts all other forms of ministry ( grief as an example) at a church. You help a parishioner or their loved one with addiction and they and the whole parish will be stronger in their support at a church.

You can do this in your diocese. It takes finding a receptive seminary contact. The ST PAUL Seminary experience provides an excellent referral review and illustrates a roadmap.
