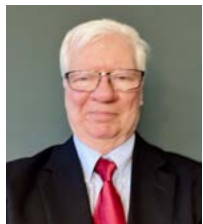

Chaplain's Corner Reflections on Gratitude

My dear Calix brothers and sisters,

Peace and Joy!

As I write this reflection, Thanksgiving Day USA is just two weeks away. Our hearts turn to a spirit of gratitude. We count our blessings. In step 2 of the twelve steps “We came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity,” “Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth.” (1 Peter 1,3-5)

Step 12: “Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of the 12 steps, we try to carry this message of hope to all alcoholics and addicts and to practice these principles in all our affairs.” How blessed and grateful are we!

To help you meditate in a spirit of gratitude I offer you some scripture texts. Enjoy! Whether you're waiting for God to speak or move, it's important to remember to practice gratitude for His presence in our daily lives, When we give thanks to God in prayer, even when it's hard to, we are promised comfort and provision for our needs.

Use this prayer as you meditate on the collection of Bible verses about gratitude and blessings — including His Word.

St. Paul is well known for writing Scriptures about being thankful. Some of his most well-known passages are focused on gratitude, including giving thanks for all things, in all circumstances ([Ephesians 5:20](#); [1 Thessalonians 5:18](#)), being thankful even in suffering ([Romans 5:3-5](#); [James 1:1-4](#)), and to do everything in the name of Jesus out of a spirit of gratefulness ([Colossians 3:17](#)). You can also use [Bible verses about thanksgiving](#) and [Psalms of Thanksgiving](#) to help you experience the power of grateful living no matter what you are facing.

Gratitude is an important aspect of a happy and fulfilling life, and the Bible has many verses that emphasize the importance of being thankful. Here are a few Bible verses about gratitude:

1. “Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” ([1 Thessalonians 5:18](#))
2. “Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.” ([Psalm 100:4](#))

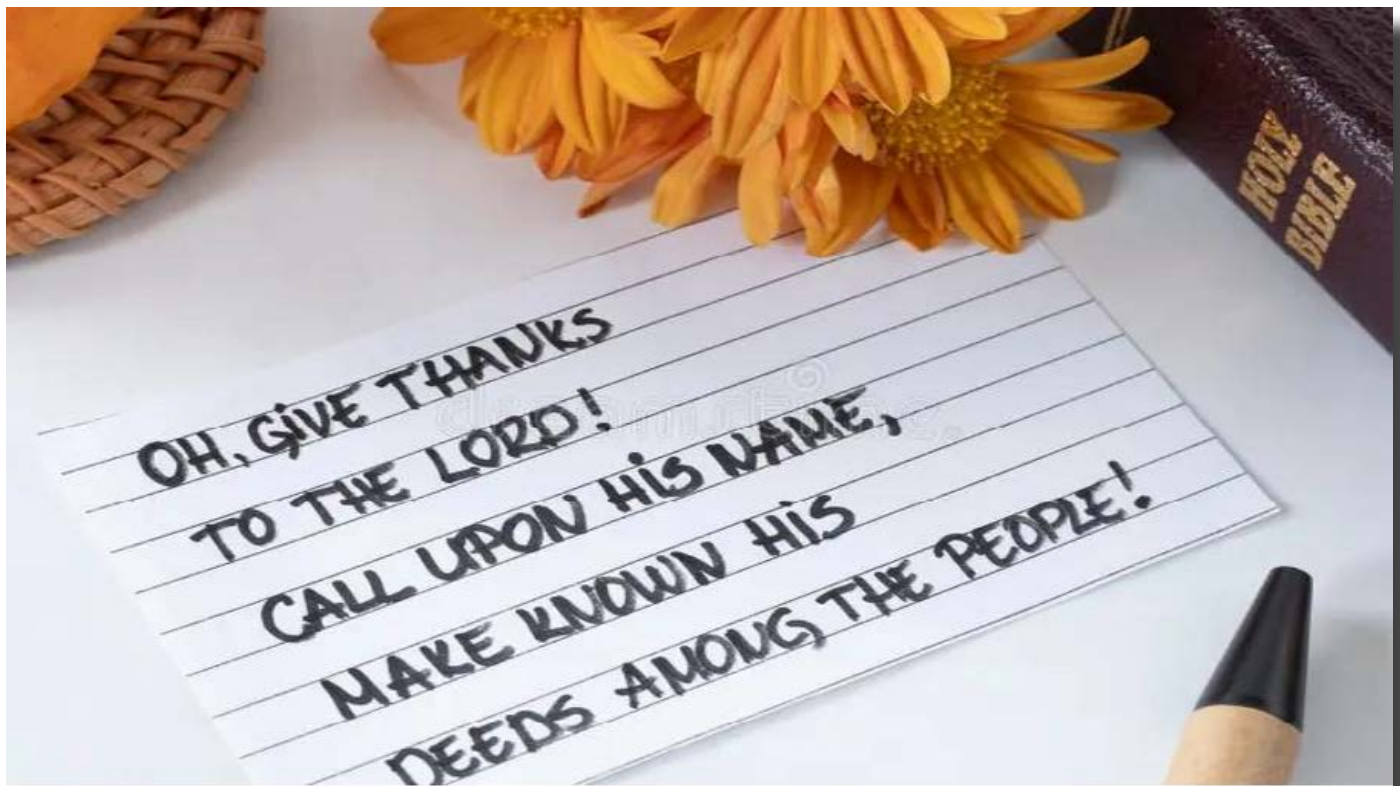


3. "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." ([Philippians 4:6](#))
4. "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful." ([Colossians 3:15](#))
5. "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." ([Colossians 3:17](#))

These verses remind us to be grateful for everything we have, even in difficult times. By expressing gratitude, we can find joy and peace in our lives and strengthen our relationship with God. Finally, one of my favorite scripture verses from St. Paul:

Ephesians 1:3–14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth in him. In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory. Amen.

Calix means a cup or chalice, used in Christian and Catholic religious services. It is a sacred cup or vessel. The chalice symbolizes the promise of eternal life and redemption offered through Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

The Calix Society is different to other organisations dealing with addictions as it aims at addressing spiritual needs of Catholics recovering from alcohol addiction, though it also ministers to those affected by other addictions. Having a spiritual base, members of Calix have a Higher Power to lean on and gather strength from other members who share similar pathways or journeys.

Calix enables members to grow in Faith, Fellowship, and Sobriety in Christ.

We are hoping in the new year to add more meetings and, God willing, to offer a spring retreat in the Rocky Mountains near Jasper.

Our unit is blessed to have Archbishop Sylvain as our spiritual director and co founder, and we are deeply grateful to Fr. Jim for hosting our monthly meetings at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Sherwood Park. We are also thankful for Fr. Mark, who assists us occasionally with Mass and our meetings and supports us with his priestly ministry.

In prayer, we entrust the growth of Calix to the Lord, asking that in time more units may be established across Alberta and throughout Canada, so that many more people wounded by addiction can encounter Christ's mercy and the support of a loving Catholic community. May Our Lady and the Venerable Matt Talbot intercede for all who are still suffering and for those who accompany them. May God bless you and your families, and may you enjoy a holy, peaceful, and very Merry Christmas.

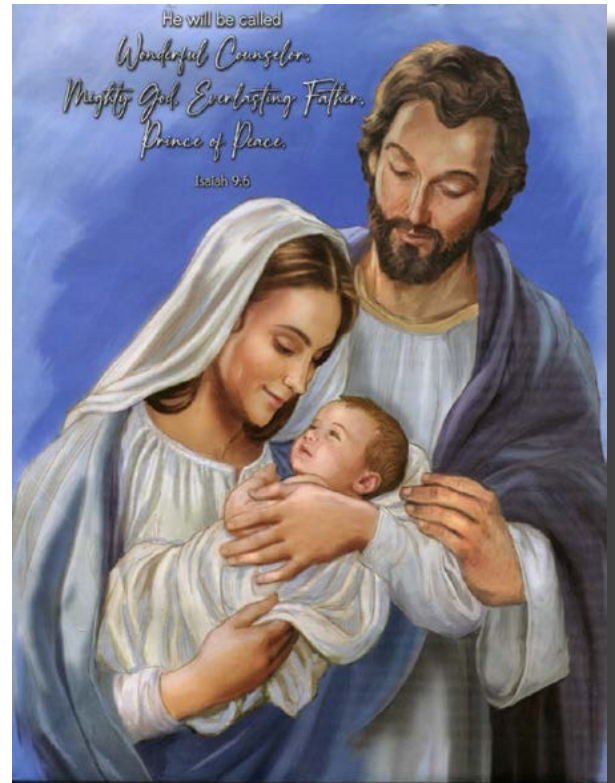

The Visitation Calix Elmhurst Unit completed its first year of monthly meetings on October 11, 2025. In October 2024, we started with a core group of 5 members, who knew each other from Alcoholics Anonymous and Calix meetings. Our current roster (email list) contains 25 members with various addiction concerns (mostly AA and Al-anon) from 5 local parishes. The age range is from 20 -75 years. We are the only unit in the Diocese of Joliet.

Our format opening includes reading the Calix Credo, Prayer for the Canonization of Matt Talbot and the Serenity Prayer. The first several meetings we shared on a short Calix reading from a collection of homilies from a previous Calix chaplain's book. We then moved on to study the short book "[The Saints who Struggled with Addiction: People are not defined by their struggles and Failures](#)" by Fr. Henry Sseriiso. Attendees are encouraged to share regarding the reading or what is hindering or helping their sobriety. They are very grateful to share the Catholic faith with reference to their addiction and 12 step challenges. We also participated in the National Calix Zoom Retreat in August 2025 and fifteen members in the Multipurpose Room engaged in the Zoom offering with over 100 members from around the country viewing the presentations.



We thank you for supporting this ministry and look forward to continue doing so on the second Saturday of every month. The room is comfortable, convenient with minimal traffic. Members offer donations and related literature is purchased for the units use.

We intend to continue to carry the message to others regarding Calix and the Visitation Unit and would be available to assist other parishes to start their own unit. Encouraging the younger adult population is also on our radar, locally and nationally, by including the Newman Centers on college campuses and the Young People's Groups of AA in our outreach.

Why Calix?

A true story:

A Catholic man in St Paul, Mn was in the throes of alcoholism and nearing his bottom. He had nowhere to turn. The chilling vapor of isolation, despair and shame enveloped him. He turned down the street to his church rather than the liquor store a few blocks up the road. He asked to see the priest, desperately seeking help. The church had no addiction ministry and the priest had only a vague idea of what Calix was.

They had a deep conversation. He made a confession. At the end of a tear filled session, the priest reached behind him and took a used book off the shelf. It was the Matt Talbot story. In it was a business card for Jim B, a man in successful recovery and Calix member. He said "call this guy, he can help". Ongoing life turbulence continued to suffocate him. In a dark moment, he found the card and called Jim B. After engaging in many discussions, he began to find his way. To this day he is the man's sponsor.

He decided to check into a treatment center. After completion, he attended a CALIX meeting and is now a part of the group, gaining strength in sobriety. He is also active in AA.

He has been helped greatly by members of the groups and their support. He continues to work a 12 step program. He has now achieved long term sobriety. Having had a dramatic spiritual awakening, relations with his family and work have been repaired.

The parish had no active addiction ministry. Thank heavens, the priest just so happened to have a CALIX member's card and gave it to him – but for that encounter would he be sober today? Was it odd or was it God?

That man was me.

Let's not leave people who need help to random circumstances. We need to make sure our parishes advise parishioners of this blessed mission. And act on it.

How I discovered more about Father Ed

As a student in the [Divine Mercy University's Spiritual Direction Certification program](#) the entire last semester has made it abundantly clear that I need to become very familiar with the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Not being a priest or in a religious order or having much Catholic education, my re-

sponse to this has largely been of the variety:

The what of the who?!

Well, I'm not the only recovering addict to say that about the Spiritual Exercises. I found out that Bill W. said pretty much the same thing to Fr. Ed Dowling.

Ok, back up... how do I know this?

Part of my course requirements have been to attend a 5 day Ignatian retreat. I was able to fulfill that requirement this past summer. I showed up at the [Bellarmine Retreat Center](#) for my required five day retreat very much looking forward to it.

Three hours into it at the closing of dinner time, they say what everyone but me knows.. this is a silent retreat from here on. Enjoy! ([Read more about my Bellarmine Retreat adventure here.](#))

What?!

That must have been in the fine print somewhere... hmmm... this is going to be interesting.

Silent, that is, except for going to Mass and meeting with my spiritual director. Her job was to lead me through some of the Spiritual Exercises.

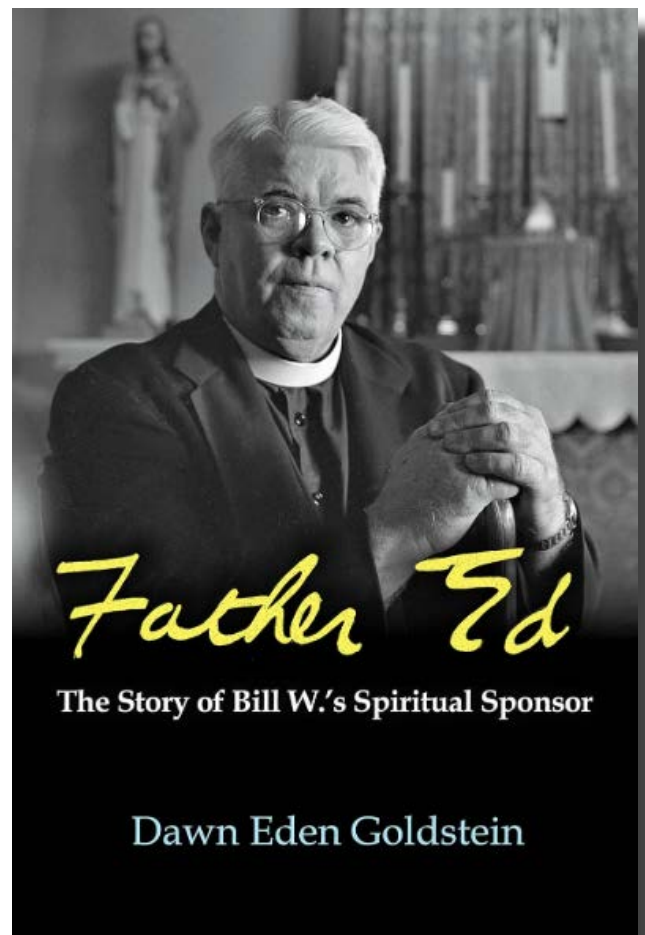
Well alrighty then!

But I needn't have been worried, God knows what he is doing.

My first meeting with my spiritual director I found out she is a recovering alcoholic, ten years sober. I'm not sure we ever got through many of the Ignatian Exercises, because we were both geeking out about being in recovery and how we work with our sponsees and so on. We spent a lot of time comparing notes on those fronts.

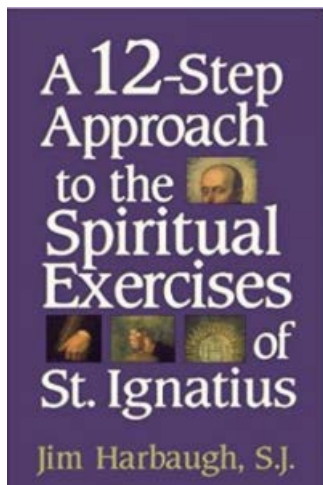
As we were talking she asked me if I'd seen the "Fr. Ed" book in the Bellarmine book store?

I said no and asked her what it was about.



Turns out, as most of you know, Fr. Ed Dowling was a great champion of the early AA organization. He also befriended Bill W. and became one his most trusted spiritual advisors.

My spiritual director then explained that the book was written by an excellent research journalist named Dawn Eden Goldstein, a Jewish convert to Catholicism. She said that Dawn takes great pains to meticulously explain how Father Ed helped Bill W. see the connections between Ignatian spirituality and the 12 steps.



So I of course bought the book along with several other of Goldstein's books (all very good by the way) and I've been slowly reading it during my weekly holy hours.

I have to say, this is really helping me get my head around the spiritual exercises now that I understand that this spirituality actually permeates much of AA and all 12 step spirituality. It is starting to make sense to me.

I guess if I'd only gone to the Calix Society Store when I first joined a few years back I might have seen the excellent book [by Father Jim Harbaugh that explains how the 12 steps are related to the Spiritual exercises](#). Maybe I'll read that one next.

But back to Goldstein's book. She is indeed an excellent researcher and an amazing story teller as well. She makes a biography interesting. I guess that isn't too hard considering the subject matter for someone like me.

Anyway, get yourself a gift this Christmas and buy "[Father Ed: The Story of Bill W's Spiritual Sponsor](#)" and sip on it. If you're like me you'll learn a whole lot about the spiritual formation that Jesuits go through at the very least (that is the first part of the book). Then I guarantee you'll learn things you never knew about the first decades of AA... Dawn Eden is one of the best research journalists I've ever read.
